Re: ACF Rules and Regulations v2024 update

In November 2022 an ACF Rules Forum was convened with all member States present. The following changes to the ACF Rules and Regulations was agreed upon by State Members at the meeting.

The v2024 ACF Rules and Regulations will become effective 1 January 2024.

Should a State not take up their full allocation for a section, a "Wild Card Draw" will allocate said entries to the other eligible States.

4.1.3.b Provided a State has a team entered in the National Championships that year, that State is eligible to submit entries for Graceful Solo/Calisthenic Solo/Duo/Trio. Applications for exemption should be submitted to the ACF. Competitors must be a registered competitor of the State Association for which the competitor is competing.
