All nominees must:

- Have adjudicated for a minimum of 30 years;
- Have adjudicated at all levels intrastate and interstate;
- Have retired from ASCA;
- Be nominated through ASCA branch and ratified by AAB;
- Meet the criteria as outlined in this document.
