

# About Pan Pac Masters Games

The 2026 Pan Pacific Masters Games is a celebration of lifelong participation, connection, and performance in Calisthenics and represents the Australian Calisthenic Federations 7<sup>th</sup> games of participation in this world class event.

It showcases the sport's unique blend of strength, artistry, and teamwork on an international stage — uniting masters competitors from across Australia, 'For the love of it!'

This event is delivered by the Australian Calisthenics Federation (ACF) under the National Competition & Event Framework (NCEF) and proudly hosted as part of the Pan Pacific Masters Games on the Gold Coast.

The 2026 competition marks a major milestone for our sport — the first time Calisthenic Solo has been offered at PPMG — expanding opportunities for participation and celebration across all disciplines.

Whether you're stepping on stage with your team or taking the spotlight as a soloist, this is your chance to perform, connect, and celebrate Calisthenics as a sport for life!

# Expressions of Interest

Submitting an Expression of Interest (EOI) is your chance to signal your intent, help the ACF plan competition logistics, anticipate numbers, and shape the event schedule. While an EOI does not guarantee entry, it ensures your club or individual team is part of the conversation as we prepare for this landmark event.

## Why submit an EOI?

- ✓ Stay in the loop: EOIs guarantee you'll receive all communications about official registration.
- ✓ Influence planning: Your submission helps us tailor schedules and resources to match demand.
- ✓ Show your intent: Demonstrate your team's enthusiasm and commitment early.

## Important to know

- EOIs are non-binding and do not secure a competition place.
- Official entries are managed directly by the Pan Pacific Masters Games via their website, are first come, first served, and will close once capacity is reached.

EOIs open 9:00am (AEDT) Monday 8 December and  
close at 8:00 PM (AEDT) Friday 19 December 2025.

We strongly encourage all Masters Teams & Individuals to submit an EOI so you don't miss vital updates about official event registration. By submitting an EOI, you agree to the event's Conditions of Entry as outlined on pages 7 & 8 of this booklet.

# Official Entry Registration

All entries for the Calisthenics Competition will be made directly through the Pan Pacific Masters Games website. Entrants must pay both the official Games Fee, the ACF Sports Fee, and the non-ACF member levy (CaliVic participants) at the time of registration.

Entries will open in March 2026 and close Sunday 30 August 2026 (11:59 PM AEST) or earlier if capacity is reached.

A waitlist will be available once the competition reaches maximum numbers in the event of withdrawals.

## **MyStage Platform:**

The ACF will manage competition scheduling and all music/lighting uploads through MyStage. Once entries are confirmed, clubs and individuals will receive MyStage access details and upload instructions.

# Competition Details

**Venue:** The Star Theatre, Broadbeach, Gold Coast, Queensland

**Dates:**

- Monday 9 - Friday 13 November 2026
- Draft scheduling will be provided to entrants who complete the EOI, and those who complete official entries once open.

**Eligibility:** Open to Master Club teams, as well as solo, graceful and duo competitors from all Australian States and Territories.

**Age Divisions:**

- Age divisions will be calculated using the median age of competitors in each team.
- Final age divisions will be confirmed at the close of official entry registration.

**Adjudication:** All sections will be adjudicated by a Panel of 3 adjudicators under ACF Rules, adjudication processes, and critique sheets.

**Items:** Clubs are invited to enter a maximum of FIVE items per team/competitors, from the following items:

- Figure March
- Free Exercises
- Club Swinging
- Rod Exercises
- Aesthetic Exercises
- Calisthenics Revue

Individuals can select to compete in one or multiple SDG items

- Calisthenic Solo
- Calisthenic Duo
- Graceful Solo

**Rules:** ACF Minimal Rules apply

**Timing** no minimum time. Maximum time 3.30mins

**Lighting:** 8 cues per item

**Stage Dressing:** Teams - Blocks and chairs will be provided for use. All other props must fit in your allocated dressing room space to be used.

# Entry Fees

All participants must pay both a Games Fee (to the Pan Pacific Masters Games) and a Sports Fee (to ACF via PPMG).

Entry fees must be paid in full at the time of Official Entry Registration, via credit card. Please note that the competition management platform may apply a credit card surcharge.

Failure to complete payment at the time of registration—including any applicable non-ACF member levy—will result in the entry being declined.

All sports fees are non-refundable. Games fees may be refunded by Event Management Queensland dependant on individual circumstances.

## Games Fee

- \$140 Early Bird (3 March – 31 May 2026)
- \$155 Saver (1 June – 31 August 2026)
- \$170 Standard (from 1 September 2026)

## Sports Fee

- \$180 Team (per team member)
- \$100 Graceful / Solo / Duo only
- \$260 Team + 1 SDG item (save \$20\*)
- \$350 Team + 2 SDG items (save \$30\*)
- \$440 Team + 3 SDG items (save \$40\*)

## Non-ACF member levy

- \$20 non-ACF member levy per participant will apply to all Victorian entrants.

\*Discount savings only applicable if all entries completed in one transaction

# Venue Information

**Venue:** A world-class venue in the heart of the Gold Coast, The Star Theatre provides a professional performance environment with exceptional stage and lighting facilities.

**Auditorium Capacity:** The venue features tiered, raked seating with a capacity of approximately 2150 seats.

**Stage:** The stage is:

- Working area dimensions: 12 metres wide × 10.2 metres deep
- Side wings: Included for entry/exit flow
- Curtains: House curtain and back curtain
- Digital Light Projection (DLP): available

Full stage dimensions and markings will be provided with the technical information pack to all teams upon acknowledgment of entry.

**Lighting:** A specified preset lighting package will be used for the competition. Teams will receive details of the available lighting presets as part of the Technical Information Pack, provided upon acknowledgment of entry.

**Dressing Rooms:** All teams will be accommodated through a combination of sectioned dressing areas with privacy screens and smaller enclosed rooms.

If your team has specific dressing room requirements, please ensure these are communicated to the ACF in the EOI (additional information section).

# Conditions of Entry

The following Conditions of Entry outline the eligibility, compliance, and operational requirements for participation in the 2026 Pan Pacific Masters Games. All clubs and teams must review and adhere to these conditions to ensure a fair, safe, and well-managed event.

By submitting an Expression of Interest (EOI) and completing the Official Entry Registration, all teams, coaches, and participants acknowledge and consent to these conditions. Without this formal acknowledgment and consent, ACF will not accept the entry.

For the purpose of the ACF Pan Pacific Masters Games Conditions of Entry, the definition of participants include:

- Competing performers
- Coaches
- Team and club management
- Team and club volunteers

**General Condition of Entry:** By participating in the 2026 ACF Pan Pacific Masters Games, all participants acknowledge and accept that calisthenics competition involves inherent physical, logistical, and environmental risks.

ACF will take all reasonable steps to provide a safe and well-managed event; however, ACF accepts no liability for injury, loss, damage, or disruption arising from participation in the event, except where required by law. It is the responsibility of each club and participant to ensure appropriate insurance coverage, risk management practices, and supervision are in place.

Participation in the event constitutes acceptance of these terms and confirmation that all individuals involved understand and assume the associated risks.

**ACF National Integrity & Safeguarding:**

- All participants are required to complete an ACF National Integrity Framework (NIF) Acknowledgement as part of the Official Entry Registration process. This ensures all participants have read the ACF NIF policies, understand and agree to the integrity expectations that apply to them.

ACF Rules: • The ACF Rules and Regulations will apply in full for the Pan Pacific Masters Games.  
 • It is the responsibility of all teams and coaches to ensure they are working from the current version of the ACF Rules and Regulations.  
 • Please note: State-specific variations or flexible rule interpretations will not be recognized at this national event.

Media Acknowledgement: All participants acknowledge and consent to the following:

#### 1. General Photography & Videography

- Give permission for the ACF to take photographs and videos of participants during competitions and associated events. These images and videos may be used for:
  - Promotional materials, including social media, website content, and printed publications.
  - Training and development purposes for participant and team improvement.
- All photography and videography will abide by the ACF NIF Safeguarding Children & Young People Policy, and:
  - Be taken by ACF-appointed accredited photographers or authorised personnel with a valid Working with Children Check (WWCC).
  - Be taken only in appropriate sporting contexts.
  - Never be taken in changing rooms, bathrooms, or other private areas.
  - Present the participant in a dignified and respectful manner, without misrepresentation of the individual, situation, context, or location.
  - Be stored securely and deleted when no longer required or upon request.

#### 2. Publication of Names

- Give permission for the participant's FIRST NAME AND THE INITIAL OF THEIR SURNAME to be published on ACF social media platforms, for the purpose of recognising competition place-getters (e.g., results, awards), and for the participant's FULL NAME to be printed in official event programs. Note: Full names will only appear in printed programs if permission is granted through this form.

# Frequently Asked Questions

**Q** Do I have to submit an Expression of Interest to enter?

**A** No. Submitting an Expression of Interest (EOI) is encouraged but not required to compete. The EOI helps the ACF plan for logistics, scheduling, and communication, and ensures that you receive all Official Entry Registration information. All official entries must be completed directly through the Pan Pacific Masters Games website — entry is confirmed on a first come, first served basis.

**Q** When do entries open?

**A** Early bird registrations will open on the PPMG website from 3 March 2026

**Q** Where do I register?

**A** All official entries must be completed through the Pan Pacific Masters Games website. ACF will not process direct entries.

**Q** Can Victorian competitors enter?

**A** Yes. Victorian clubs and competitors are welcome and pay a \$20 non-member levy in addition to the sports fee.


**Q** Do I have to be in a competing team to do a solo, duo or graceful?

**A** No, you can compete in the solo, duo or graceful sections, without being a part of a PPMG team as long as you are a registered participant with your State Association.

**Q** What happens if entries close early?

**A** Entries are expected to fill up fast.

Once maximum capacity is reached, a waitlist will be available. Spaces will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis as they become available.
